

About the 2019 Animals Clipart Collection

I wanted to include all clip art for download in the **2019 Animals Clipart Collection**. The original game (2008) included art that I drew especially for the game, such as for the clues, but individual animals were mostly from the IntelliTools Classroom Suite® and Clicker 5® media libraries. Those weren't part of the original clip art download.

I found or drew new animals art for the web version, locating public domain images and adapting them so that they can be added to the clip art collection. There are at least four versions of each animal clip: a png and a jpg version about 600 pixels wide, and a png and a jpg very small version around 100 pixels wide. I'm including the png versions because they have a transparent background. Depending on what applications you use, these may be easier put on a solid color background or into a scene.

There are some extra animals in the collection, such as a bactrian camel and a sea turtle. In some cases, there are three instead of two sizes. There also is a folder containing artwork for the clues; not the entire page from the game but what is on the easel. I have included these for creating matching and sorting games as extension activities, either off or on the computer.

Finally, I included folders with the stage and easel, all the computer cartoons, and miscellaneous other clips like the Yes and No faces, a spiderweb, and a water splash. You can see the water splash in use on the dolphin page in **What I Like Best About Animals**. It's semi-transparent, and if you add it to a photo of a lake, ocean, or other water surface, it gives a convincing effect. Try erasing a tiny bit to shape the bottom to the ripples, and leaning it where needed. I've also had some luck turning it upside down to make a waterfall. I'm hoping you'll find all kinds of uses for the items in the clip art collection!

Art For The Clue Pages

Original work by Ann Brundige includes: illustrations for pouch, bill, soft, hibernate, mane, arms, and various legs. Two clues (feathers, flippers) include portions of photos by Ann Brundige. The photos in the fur and scales clues are from textures.com. Public domain photos, illustrations, or clip art images are the clues for South Pole, antlers, eggs, webbed feet, change colors, farm, shell, bones, ocean, fins, hump, hop, and fly, although I changed these up quite a bit in most cases.

Art For Animals Pages And Clip Art Collection

Original work by Ann Brundige: Platypus, two echidnas, camel, and the running ostrich. I drew these from an old watercolor (platypus), a photograph on Flickr (camel), a photo and a screengrab from a video (echidnas) and a combination of photos and clip art (running ostrich). I also adapted photos into clip art for the earthworm, Adelie penguin and sliding Emperor penguin, Bactrian camel snapping turtle, and jellyfish, from public domain photos from Pixabay, and turned the standing kangaroo from Wikimedia into a hopping kangaroo.

In many cases, I did extensive editing, for example, I used completely different colors for the frog, chameleon, and ostrich; and I cut the eagle out of a full scene, changing the colors also. Clip art animals from Pixabay include: Alligator, bear, beetle, bactrian camel, chameleon, cow, crab, deer, dolphin, eagle, earthworm, fish, frog, jellyfish, lion, 2 octopuses, ostrich, standing Emperor penguin, snake, spider, swan, and turtle.

Wikimedia.org The Kangaroo, Wolf, and Zebra were adapted from line drawings from Wikimedia Commons. These are all old, public domain line drawings cleaned up and donated to Wikimedia Commons by Pearson Scott Foresman. I added color and shading. The platypus was drawn from a photo of an old watercolor, Platypus_by_Lewin.jpg by John Lewin 1808 (CC PD)

Public Domain Clipart (pdclipart.com) The Rabbit and standing King Penguin came from this site, which has all public domain images. The "rabbit" originally was a brown hare, but I remodeled him.

Other Clip Art

Stage and Easel folder is original art by Ann Brundige. There are several different lighting effects for the stage, and you could use the easel for any kind of sign or add clip art to it.

Computer Cartoons folder has the poses and facial expressions for the little computer cartoon, all original art by Ann Brundige.

Bonus Clip Art folder has miscellaneous clipart including Yes and No buttons, blue flag, light blast effect, the spiderweb, the water splash, and amphibian bones. The light blast is original, other images adapted from public domain art from Pixabay.com.
